- 3) Please consider making an additional contribution to our Chapter above your dues amount. This enables us to continue quality programs and strengthens our Chapter's leadership role.

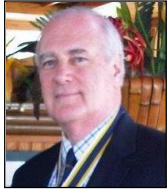

## Calling All SAR Veterans !

The Certificate of Patriotism is awarded by the NSSAR to recognize Military Service. There are two types of recognition for veterans, the NSSAR Veterans Corps, and the FLSSAR Veterans Battalion. Each program has different requirements as described on the individual survey forms.

The NSSAR Corps has more limited requirements to be honored in any of the Corps (WWII, Korean, Vietnam, Persian Gulf War, Special Ops, etc.). President Generals continue to add additional Corps as Military actions continue and are kept up to date. Some Veterans are eligible for more than one Corps.

Veterans eligible for the War Service Medal (“WSM”) and the Military Service Medal (“MSM”) are eligible for membership in the NSSAR Veterans Corp. Eligibility for each Medal is determined by the DD 214 form and evaluation of the Survey Form.

The Florida Veterans Battalion requirements are for veterans who served in the Armed Forces on Active Duty, Reserves, National Guard, Cadet or Midshipman at one of the Service Academies and who were Honorably Discharged. This Award is designed to Honor all Florida SAR Veterans for their Military Service.

Certificates are issued for each program.

There are two certificates awarded:

NSSAR awards a Certificate of Patriotism, signed by the President General.

FLSSAR awards a Veteran's Battalion Certificate signed by the FLSSAR President and the Florida Veterans Recognition Committee Chairman.

Award Certificates permit the wearing of appropriate WSM or MSM medals. The medals may be purchased by the applicant and can be presented along with certificates at some future date. If you are or you know of a Chapter Compatriot who is a Veteran please contact me.
