17 December 2016

Morrill Worcester was a 12-year-old paperboy for the Bangor Daily News when he won a trip to Washington, D.C. His first trip was to Arlington National Cemetery and it made an impression on him that he would never forget. In 1992, the Worcester Wreath Company, which he owns, found themselves with a surplus of wreaths nearing the end of the holiday season. He remembered his experience at Arlington. With that experience, he had an opportunity to honor our country's veterans. With the help of Maine Senator Olympia Snowe, arrangements were made for him to place the wreaths in an older section of the cemetery that had been receiving fewer visitors with each passing year. Sons of the American Revolution St Petersburg Chapter Povember 19, 2016

Call to Order: The monthly meeting held at the Hangar restaurant in St. Petersburg was called to order at 11:45 by President Alan Craig, and the invocation was given by Chaplain David Chestnut.

Guests: Prospective members Mike Black and James Kent; retired Air Force pilot Mike Henchey; DAR guests including Merri Ray and Vanessa Talbott; Jenna DeMott of the Clear Water Harbor CAR Society.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes for the October 2016 meeting were approved.

Officer Reports: Secretary Peter Ford requested that all submissions for the monthly chapter newsletter be sent to him by one week after the meeting. David Chestnut said that our chapter's color guard will be joining the Tampa SAR's color guard for the Wreaths Across America program next month. Charles Butler reported that he is working on the "SAR Orientation 101" initiative, and that John Stewart is chairing the Florida committee that is part of NSSAR's initiative to update SAR's planning process and procedures.

Program

President Craig presented the Bronze Good Citizenship Award to Will Tirone, a senior at Shorecrest Prep. Will is a 4.0 student, an athlete, and is extremely involved in volunteer work locally, out of state, and internationally.

Retired Air Force fighter pilot Col. Mike Henchey spoke about his experiences over several decades in the service, from the Academy in the 1970's through postings around the world through the 1990's.

Cory Price, Assistant Director of the Bay Pines Veterans Health Care System, spoke on the services offered by Bay Pines. The system operates with a \$700 million annual budget and 4,000 employees, and served over 108,000 veterans last year. The VA system offers many services critical to veterans, including treatment of PTSD, amputees, and mental health treatment.


Jenna DeMott spoke about her involvement in the Veteran's History Project, in which veterans from World War I through the current conflicts are interviewed and videotaped regarding their experiences in service to the country. The collected materials will be archived at the Library of Congress. Information on the Project can be found at www.loc.gov/vets. Jenna shared excerpts of her interviews with Lt. Col. George Smith and Col. Pat Niemann, SAR Regional VP and frequent guest at our chapter's meetings.

Vanessa Talbott spoke about the Stars and Stripes luncheon being hosted by the Clearwater DAR on March 25, 2017. The luncheon will be a fundraiser primarily for local veterans and it includes a silent auction.
