In the spring of 1866 the Ladies Memorial Association of Columbus, Georgia passed a resolution to set aside one day annually to memorialized the Confederate war dead. Mary Ann Williams, the association secretary, was directed to pen a letter inviting ladies associations in every Southern state to join them in this observance. The

Union GAR eventually adopted the name Memorial Day at their national encampment in 1882.

Program

Compatriot Bob Rogers, a member of the Mayflower Society, gave a very interesting presentation that began with Martin Luther, who founded the Protestant Reformation. The ensuing split from the Catholic Church led to the oppression of Protestants, and inspired them to seek religious freedom in the new world. Of the 107 passengers on the Mayflower only 53 survived the first winter. The Pilgrims developed their own form of self-government, as set forth in the Mayflower Compact.
