This past July I had the pleasure of visiting Louisville, Kentucky which of course included a visit to the Sons of the American Revolution headquarters and library. Exploring this large library is something that cannot be done in one visit. I did locate the five volume set of “The Munson Record,” which members of my family donated to the library a few years ago. I was able to see the area that will be designated for the new museum. It will house many works of art and artifacts owned by the

The main reason for going to Louisville was the semiannual reunion of the Thomas Munson Foundation. This year they have been celebrating the 380th anniversary of Thomas Munson coming to the new world in 1637. He was one of the founders of the Hartford colony which became Connecticut. At the TMF banquet, I had the honor to present the colors in my Revolutionary War uniform of the 1st Virginia Regiment. My flag was gratefully borrowed from the DAR chapter in New Albany, Indiana.

Among the many places of interest to visit in the area is the Scribner House in New Albany, Indiana which is the home of the DAR in the area. The local DAR chapter has lovingly restored the building and now opens it for tours. The home was built by Joel, Nathaniel and Abner Scribner on the banks of the Ohio River. They founded New Albany when they arrived here on flatboat from Pennsylvania in the early nineteenth century.

Another place of interest is historic Locust Grove set on fifty-five rolling acres on the Kentucky side of the Ohio River and is a must see. Built in the 1790s by William and Lucy Croghan, it was home to their family and Lucy's brother, Revolutionary War hero General George Rogers Clark. Clark founded the town of Louisville, captured the Northwest Territory from the British in 1779, and lived here during the last years of his life.

I highly recommend a visit to the Louisville area as it has so much to see and do.

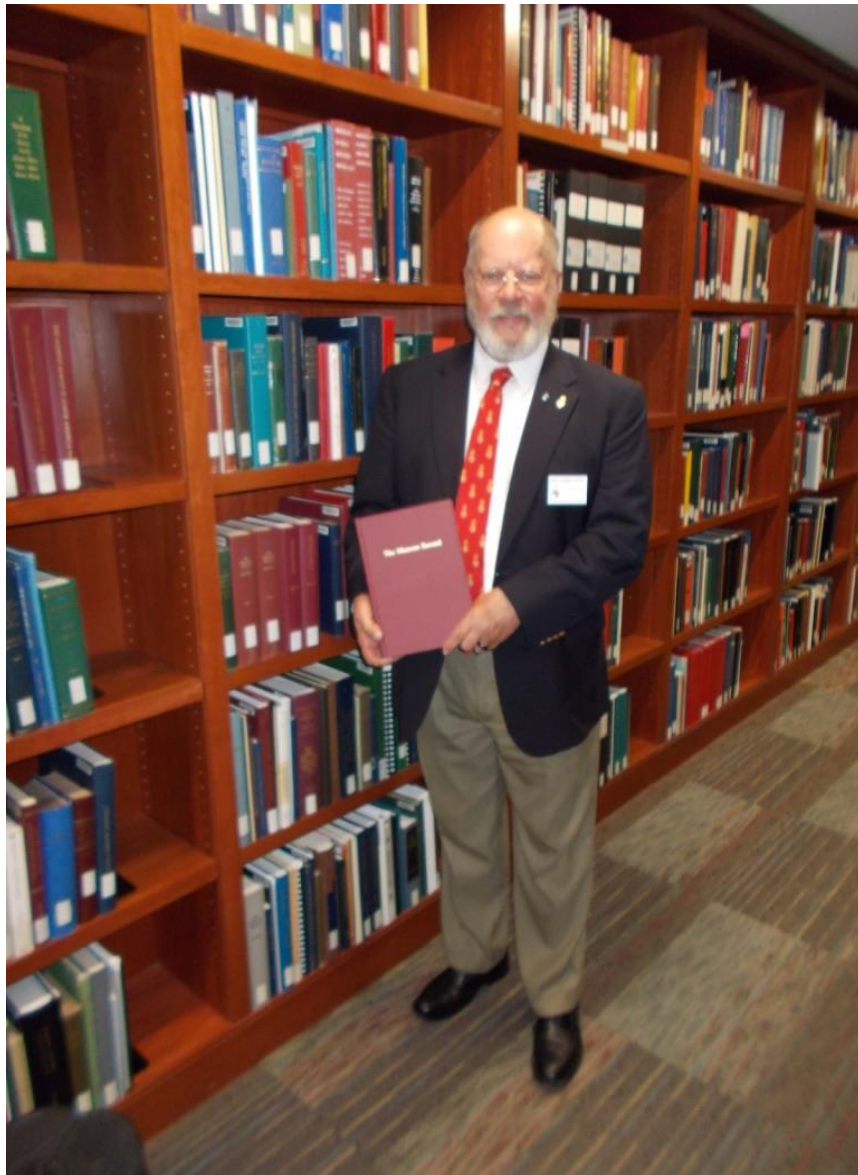
New member Mike Black was also inducted into the chapter.

VETERAN'S DAY GUEST SPEAKER

Rear Admiral John Kirby, USN (ret), is a CNN military and diplomatic analyst and most recently served as Assistant Secretary of State for Public Affairs. Kirby appears regularly on The Situation Room with Wolf Blitzer and across all of CNN's programming providing analysis on issues related to the U.S. military, defense, foreign affairs and diplomacy.

Prior to joining CNN, Kirby had a 29-year career with the United States Navy, joining after college and eventually retiring as Rear Admiral in 2015. In 2011, then-Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta appointed Kirby to Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Media Operations. Two years later, after serving as the U.S. Navy's Chief of Information, Kirby was chosen as Pentagon Press Secretary and became the first uniformed officer to hold the position. Following his military career, Kirby returned to government to serve as the Spokesperson for the U.S. State Department. Soon after, he was appointed by then-President Obama to take on the role of Assistant Secretary of State for the Bureau of Public Affairs, a title he held until the end of the Obama administration.

Kirby is from St. Petersburg, Florida, and holds a B.A. in History from the University of South Florida, as well as an M.S. in International Relations from Troy State University and an M.A. in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College.
