No objections were voiced to the document as written, and after review and discussion, the Tampa Bay SAR Education Initiative's Statement of Purpose was unanimously approved by the Tampa Bay Education SAR Initiative Board Members.

Sons of the American Revolution St Petersburg Chapter April 20, 2019

Call to Order: The monthly meeting held at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club was called to order at 11:30 AM by President Bob Rogers and the invocation was given by John Stewart.

Guests: Marine Sergeants Brent Johnson and Jared Defoore, DAR members Coleen Pauley Perry and Cathy Paunov, and prospective member Peter Bruno.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the March 16 meeting were approved as submitted.

Officer Reports & Presentations

John Stewart presented our chapter with a streamer for our participation in a ceremony commemorating the battle of Thomas Creek in northeast Florida, in which militia members were attacked in 1777 by Loyalists, British soldiers, and Creek Indians. It is considered the only Revolutionary War battle in Florida.

John Stewart reported on the Nominating Committee's slate for the 2019-2020 chapter year. The membership will vote at the May 18 meeting.

Charles Butler updated the members on our Education Initiative. We are working with the Tampa chapter, with support from several DAR chapters. The initial meeting will be on April 26. Our September 14 meeting will include a presentation by Joseph Hardesty, the NSSAR library director, on the US census and family research.

Guest Speakers

After introductory comments by SSgt. Johnson, Sgt. Defoore spoke about their role as Marine recruiters in Pinellas County. Their challenge is "finding our replacements." Many millennials are ill-informed about the military and the careers available, as only 20% of the jobs in the Corps are combat-related.



There are 360 different job classifications, including photography, technology, medical, and legal. The public is focused on warfare, and often overlooks the benefit of four years of paid college. He also noted that some high schools are more "open" to military recruiting visits than others.

John Stewart gave the benediction, and President Rogers adjourned the meeting at 1:30 PM.
