
Lori Coffey of the Pinellas Genealogy Society will present "Women of 1776", This is a great event to bring your wife or partner to.

#### THIS MONTH IN REVOLUTIONARY WAR HISTORY

• 1770-Apr 12<sup>th</sup>:- North Carolina's Provincial Congress authorized its delegates to the Second Continental Congress to vote for independence. The first formal call for American sovereignty, the "Halifax Resolves," not only guided North Carolina representatives, but also encouraged the Continental Congress to champion independence.



- 1751-Apr 13<sup>th</sup>:-Thomas Jefferson was born at Shadwell in Albemarle County, Virginia 1776-Mar 15<sup>th</sup>:- Although Major General Nathanael Greene was defeated at the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, North Carolina, the British were so weakened by their victory that Cornwallis abandoned his plan to reconquer the colony and instead marched north into Virginia

I was born at Mound Park hospital (now Bayfront) I attended both Shore Acres Elementary and Rivera Junior High then moving to Upstate New York during High School where I graduated and then joined the U.S. Air Force. I'm also a University of Tampa alumn.

Why and how long have you been in the SAR?

It was on my "bucket list" since my father had been a member of the St Petersburg Chapter in the late 1940s. Both my son and I joined in 2018.
